# The talented Mr. Ripley

Text taken from *First Expert* (PearsonLongman)

#### **Objectives:**

to use peer feedback to improve reading comprehension

#### Stages:

- Read the text individually in about 10 minutes.
- In groups of three, discuss a possible summary and help each other to solve doubts about the text.
- Play Kahoot quiz with your group about this text.
- 2-minute time limit to answer, enough to allow for discussion.



# The talented Mr. Ripley

#### Advantages:

- Avoidance of different activity completion speeds.
- Peer feedback + teacher feedback
- Motivation and competitiveness
- Enhancement of range of activities on the text.
- Instant and detailed feedback for teachers.
- Identification of difficult question types (vocabulary-based...)

to check general and detailed understanding

#### Stages:

- Read the text individually in about 8 minutes.
- Work in pairs and talk about the questions in exercise 2
- Play a Kahoot to check your understanding of the text



### The street

#### Strategies:

- Use of different question types: title, comprehension, vocab...
- Some questions with more than one correct answer
- Room for eliciting student feedback
- Competition in terms of speed, questions are easy.



## Spine-chilling Honeymoon

#### Strategies:

- Fostering reading without focusing on questions.
- Encouraging peer feedback on ideas and vocabulary.
- Checking comprehension competitively.
- Relax / enjoyment after reading + speaking



# Spine-chilling Honeymoon

Same text, different response systems.

Socrative / paper: heterogeneous answer speeds, higher scores, more time spent

Kahoot: lower scores, it's easier to make a mistake due to time pressure. Unified answer pace / teacher and peer feedback




### Vacuum tube travel

Traditional activity adapted to Kahoot

Objective: foster peer discussion and analysis





### Vacuum tube travel

We'll show students a video about a futuristic means of transport, the <a href="https://hyperloop.">hyperloop</a>.

After they've watched the video, they can discuss the following questions for five minutes in pairs or groups of three.

What does the special transport system consist of?

Who's behind the idea?

What other systems is this new transport compared to?

How fast is it? To what other transports is it compared?

Is it going to be very expensive?

Then, we can play the Kahoot, in pairs or in groups.
